Costs

320 € registration fee (including public transportation ticket for North-Rhine-Westphalia) in addition to your home university's tuition fee for the program.

400 – 600 € for housing (4-week-stay).

300 € for your living expenses (4-week-stay, depending on your lifestyle).

Housing

Participants arrange housing individually. The summer school team is happy to offer assistance.

Academics

You will be able to earn up to 12 ECTS (6 ECTS per course, European credit point system). Credits may differ depending on your home university, but usually correspond to 6 (3) credits in the North American system. Please check with your exchange coordinator.
